Internship tasks

During my internship I had the great opportunity to explore different sections and to complete a broad variety of tasks. My main tasks included the following:

Intercultural and Social Skills Training

I developed and conducted several intercultural training sessions to improve students' intercultural competence and to prepare them for their future stay in Germany. The intercultural workshops covered topics like cultural research, intercultural communication, German cultural habits as well as the analysis of behavioral differences. Regularly, I offered counseling services to settle cultural and social issues regarding students' study period in Germany. I supported students in various questions, including topics like network building, students' associations and opportunities for integration.
